Day by Day Itinerary

May 19 Day 1 Departure: Our spiritual pilgrimage begins as we board our transatlantic flight to Warsaw, with meals and beverages served aloft.

May 20 Day 2 Arrive Warsaw: After arrival in Warsaw, we are met by our representative and transferred to our hotel. Discover the "new" Warsaw, which has been lovingly restored after the devastation of World War II. Overnight: Warsaw (Dinner)

May 21 Day 3 Warsaw: Stanislaw Kostka Church, Old Town Square: Begin with morning mass at St. Stanislaw Kostka Church, where martyred Solidarity priest Father Popieluszko worked and is buried. Explore the bustling Old Town Square, where horse-drawn carriages carry visitors past beautifully rebuilt Baroque houses and Renaissance-style storefronts. Traditional Polish cafes and shops surround the square, which has been restored to its 13th-century charm. Stroll the streets of this historic area, mostly closed to traffic, and visit its beautiful churches and castle. See the birthplace of Madame Curie, Chopin's monument, and the Royal Castle (exterior view), which was the residence of Polish Kings. Overnight: Warsaw (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 22 Day 4 Warsaw / Krakow: Jasna Gora Monastery, Black Madonna, Auschwitz: Depart Warsaw and drive to Czestochowa, a city which has been for the last 600 years the principal center of the Catholic religion in Poland and is a shrine for pilgrims. Visit Jasna Gora Monastery with religious, historic, and artistic value, and participate in the unveiling of the Black Madonna. Our guide will show us the Gothic Chapel of Our Lady, in which hangs the famous Black Madonna icon on a magnificent silver and ebony altar. Tour the treasury and celebrate mass at the Shrine. After Lunch proceed to Auschwitz for a guided tour of the infamous death camp where millions were killed during World War II. Continue to Krakow, our home for the next three nights.

Overnight: Krakow (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 23 Day 5 Krakow: Wawel Hill, Church of St. Stanislaw, Kanonicza Street, St. Faustina Shrine: Following breakfast, proceed to Wawel Hill and celebrate mass at the Church of St. Stanislaw, Poland's second most important pilgrimage shrine. Visit Krakow's cathedral, which serves as the nation's spiritual capital and has witnessed most of the royal coronations and funerals of the last millennium. See the Cathedral's Treasury and continue to Krakow's Old Town to see Kanonicza Street where Pope John Paul II resided while living in Krakow. Visit the courtyard of the Collegium Mauis; see the ancient Market Square and Cloth Hall. This afternoon, stop at Lagwieniki to visit St. Faustina Shrine before returning to Krakow. **Overnight**: Krakow (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 24 Day 6 Krakow: Wieliczka Salt Mines, Wadowice, Kalwaria Zebrzydowska: This morning we drive to Wieliczka to see the oldest salt mine in Europe, a world-class tourist attraction. It is a unique place where many generations of Polish miners have created a world of underground salt lakes with a rich interior of decorated chapels including the famous Blessed Kings Chapel, plus other galleries and workings made of salt. Wieliczka salt mine is listed by UNESCO as a World Cultural Heritage Site. Then proceed to Wadowice, birthplace of Karol Wojtyla, the late Pope John Paul II. His museum is in his family house. Continue to Kalwaria Zebrzydowska, a popular pilgrimage place for the Pope when he was a young man, where in the 17th century the Palatine of Krakow founded a Franciscan Monastery. The church has very rich Baroque decorations. On the slope of the hill and in the valley is an architectural 'Way of the Cross' comprising 42 Mannerist and Baroque chapels and some small Calvary churches. **Overnight**: Krakow (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 25 Day 7 Krakow / Prague: Velehrad Golden Rose: Depart this morning for the Czech capital of Prague. En route, stop at Velehrad to visit the Shrine in memory of the two missionaries from Byzantium, "Cyril and Methodius," who brought Christianity to the Czech lands. In 1985, His Holiness Pope John Paul II conferred the "Golden Rose" on Velehrad, a Papal distinction conveyed to only three other venerable places of pilgrimage: Lourdes, Guadalupe, and Czestochowa. Continue to the "Golden City" of Prague, one of Europe's most attractive capitals. Overnight: Prague (Breakfast, Dinner) May 26 Day 8 Prague: Prague Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral, Charles Bridge, Loreto Shrine: Spanning the River Vltava, Prague ranks as one of the most beautifully preserved cities in Europe. The town is famous for its Gothic and Baroque architecture. Marvel at the graceful enormity of Prague Castle and St. Vitus Cathedral, the Church of Our Lady of Victory, and the statue of the Infant Jesus of Prague. After mass, cross the historic Charles Bridge, built in 1400, and admire its Baroque statuary. Continue to the Loreto Shrine, one of the most important places of pilgrimage in Eastern Europe. Recall the timeless masterpieces of Mozart, Wagner, and Berlioz while viewing the city's many theaters and opera houses.

Overnight: Prague (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 27 Day 9 Prague / Vienna: Cesky Krumlov: Depart Prague this morning and take a scenic ride through the countryside to Cesky Krumlov and enjoy a walking tour of this beautiful Renaissance town. Then continue our drive into Austria until reaching the imperial city of Vienna for dinner and overnight. Overnight: Vienna (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 28 Day 10 Vienna: Town Hall, State Opera House, Belvedere Palace, St. Stephen's Cathedral, Hofburg Palace, Schonbrunn Palace: A wealth of treasures awaits us in Vienna - one of Europe's most dynamic cities. Our tour of Vienna includes visits to the Town Hall, the State Opera House, Belvedere Palace, which is the former residence of the Prince of Savoy, St. Stephen's Cathedral, St. Charles Church, Hofburg Palace, and the Kaisergruft. The highlight of the tour is a visit to the magnificent Schonbrunn Palace with its 1,400 elaborately decorated rooms and gardens. **Overnight**: Vienna (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 29 Day 11 Melk / Vienna: Melk Abbey, Danube River Cruise, Krems: Early this morning we visit Melk Abbey, one of the most imposing architectural masterpieces north of the Alps and a focal point in the formative years of Austria's history. 1989 marked the 900th anniversary of the day on which Melk was given over to Benedictine monks. Immediately following our visit to Melk Abbey, we enjoy a cozy passage on board ship in the Wachau region, which was included in the UNESCO World Heritage list for its exceptional beauty. Among the highlights are the Melk Abbey, the Schönbühel Castle, and the town of Dürnstein with its blue tower. The cozy onboard restaurant serves local specialties, such as apricot dumplings, and excellent wines from the Wachau to round off the trip on the waves of the Danube. We end our cruise in Krems, then return to Vienna for an evening at leisure. Overnight: Vienna (Breakfast, Dinner) May 24 Day 12 Vienna / Budapest: Bratislava Castle, Michael's Gate, St. Martin's Cathedral, Budapest River Bridge: This morning we depart Vienna and drive to Bratislava, the capital of Slovakia. Here we will visit the picturesque Old Town, Michael's Gate, Bratislava Castle, and St. Martin's Cathedral. Then continue to lovely Budapest, the capital of Hungary, which straddles the Danube River. The Buda Hills rise on one side of the river, housing the city's ancient past, and Pest is on the other side, modern and inviting. The two are linked with a series of elegant bridges.

Overnight: Budapest (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 30 Day 13 Budapest: Hero's Square, St. Stephen's Basilica, Fishermen's Bastion, Castle District: This morning we will visit Hero's Square, one of the largest and most inspiring spaces in Budapest, with its towering stone column and statue of the Archangel Gabriel. Then celebrate Mass in St. Stephen's Basilica. Next, discover the magic of Fishermen's Bastion, with seven stone towers overlooking the famous river, and the distinctive Castle District with St. Mathias Church.

Overnight: Budapest (Breakfast, Dinner)

May 31 Day 14 Return Home: This morning we board our flights home, carrying with us memories and keepsakes that will last a lifetime.

By making any payments (cash, credit card or otherwise) towards any tour constitutes your unconditional acceptance of all the terms and conditions stated in this brochure. Holy Land Travel Center shall be referred to as HLTC within this document.

DOCUMENTS: US citizens require a valid passport. Other nationalities please inquire with the appropriate embassies.

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSIT: Deposit of \$500 per person is required upon registration along with a signed copy of the registration form. Registrations are processed in the order received by HLTC Final payment is due 45 days prior to departure. Late payments are subject to a \$50 late fee per week past the due date. HLTC reserves the right to cancel reservations whose payments are 30 days late and to apply applicable cancellation/penalties indicated below. No registrations can be made over the telephone.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION FEES & REFUNDS: Upon cancellation of participation of tour by you, the registrant, for any reason, and only after HLTC receives your written cancellation via email used to register or by US mail., HLTC will then refund your payment for services not received by you, minus applicable cancellation fees per person, according to the following schedule:

- Minimum cancellation fee is \$500 from time of registration up to 120 days prior to the tour's departure date.
- From 119 to 60 days prior to departure day, the cancellation fee is \$500 + 20% of total price.
- 3) From 59 days to 31 days prior to departure day, cancellation fee is \$500 + 50% of total price.
- 4) From 30 days prior to departure day onward, no refund is possible.

LAND TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSFERS: By private deluxe motor coach.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Tour prices are per person, based on two persons sharing double or twinbedded rooms with a private bathroom with tub or shower. In the event that one does not sign up with a roommate and is not able to be paired with another traveler, there will be a single supplement charge to the account. Single rooms subject to availability and an additional cost indicated on the brochure. Accommodations are subject to change due to upgrade, size of group, etc.

MEALS: Meals in accordance with the itinerary. All beverages are extra.
